In our efforts to dig up any slot/perimeter related content during the McDonnell years, my MWAA state counterpart found a <u>VA Assembly Resolution</u> dating back to 1999. The resolution expresses the support of maintaining the 1250-mile perimeter and two of the provisions specifically reference the harm to regional air transportation and air service to small communities within the perimeter.

In reviewing the legislative history, the timing on this would have been ahead of the 2000 FAA reauthorization which resulted in the creation of 24 slot exemptions (12 inside / 12 outside).

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First, congrats Karen! Good luck in the new role.

Second, I spoke with Michael Sargent and Rachel Jones, Deputy Secretaries of Transportation in Richmond. I shared with them our perspective on the slot/perimeter issue. They are aware of the issue but still in "fact gathering mode." They main piece they appear to be waiting on is a formal briefing from MWAA, which they said is in the works(?). However, they did give some positive signals, talking about the Governor's recognition of the importance of economic development at Dulles.

Third, our chief of staff spoke to Gov. Youngkin's chief who said, that he always "make the point that they always want to understand if something needs to be to changed and if something doesn't, then they wouldn't support changing it." He further said that he didn't think they had any reason for the rules to be changed in this instance.

I think that stuff wouldn't hurt, but the sense I got was that air operations—congestion, safety, that sort of thing—is going to carry the most weight.

Additionally, yesterday I was with Warner at the American Airlines reception, where CEO Robert Isom make clear to the Senator that he was opposing changes to the slot/perimeter rule. He said something to the effect of "we've built our business around the perimeter rule with investments at Dulles" and that anyone looking to change the rule "should come talk to me."

Nick, Evan and I met with and and and from Commerce majority. Here are some notes, in no particular order:

- asked about the physical capacity of National to handle more flights. We told him about crowding, lines, etc, but we didn't have any information about airspace congestion or the idea that having more flights into and out of National might be dangerous or difficult to safely do. Do you have any material on that?
- mentioned that they weren't sure where Alaska Air is, and indicated he thought that there might be some proposed changes to the slot/perimeter rule that Alaska could be comfortable with.
- mentioned San Diego as a city that has been advocating for service to National.
- Chair Graves in the House is apparently deeply emotionally committed to getting an FAA reauth done. Hopefully someone has made clear to him that tinkering with the slot/perimeter rule could delay the bill by five years like it did in 2007-12.
- asked us if there was a universe in which we could get comfortable with a single additional slot for San Antonio. We did not give a substantive answer, but highlighted how once you open the door for a single slot you let in the avalanche.
- Cruz's starting position may be fairly radical. Apparently his staff have been arguing against the slot/perimeter rule on free-market grounds.
